- Talk (interaction level +): Keynote, lecture, fireside chat, reading, interview. We are looking for challenging and entertaining presentations by qualified persons. (1-2 speakers, 30-60 minutes)
- Discussion (interaction level ++): Fishbowl, panel, debate, dialogue. We are looking for sessions that create a dialog with the audience and invited experts. (2-3 speakers + 1 moderator, 60 minutes)
- Workshop (interaction level +++): Hands-on, interactives, group activities, intense interaction with the audience, something in partnership at eye level to produce and develop things together. (1-2 Hosts, 60-120 minutes) Please indicate in the description, how many people can participate and what the outcome should be.
- Meetup (interaction intensity ++++): Meeting of like-minded people, creates opportunities to get to know each other. No speech or input, just a common topic or interest. (1-2 Hosts, 30 or 60 minutes)
- Action (interaction intensity ++++): Flashmob, field research, installations, exhibitions, concerts, pop up happenings, DJ Sets, user generated content, initiating actions with the conference visitors and spontaneous work with the results and features.
